Apple Cider

Each fall, we gather apples from an orchard in Eastern Washington to be used to make homemade apple cider. We invite friends from Faith Church to host a squeeze in their neighborhood and invite friends and neighbors to join.

The church will provide the apples, the presses and all of the equipment. We have some sterilized bottles for each venue. Instructions are supplied. All you need to provide is the muscle! We suggest planning about 2 hours for an event. Each box of apples produces about 2 gallons of cider. If you would like to host a squeeze at your place, please contact the office. We can only guarantee adequate apples for events scheduled before October 10.

The annual apple picking will be Saturday, October 13. The carpool leaves church at 8 AM and returns about 4 PM. Recommended attire is layers. Check the weather report for Yakima.
